Who is Operation Adopt a Soldier?

"Operation Adopt a Soldier, Inc." (OAAS) is an all volunteer, not for profit organization, comprised of many men and women who all are committed to the goals as stated in our mission statement. OAAS, Inc. originated at Mt McGregor Correctional Facility in Wilton, NY. In the first months of the war in Iraq, the employees spearheaded by Cliff Seguin began sending care package to one platoon of soldiers from the 368th Combat Engineers of which Cliff's son Steven was a member. Later that same year while Cliff was attending a Support Our Troops Rally and fundraiser organized by Dominick Commisso who himself was sending care packages to his two sons Jason and Michael's platoons also serving in army units in Iraq, a partnership was formed. In early 2004, Terry Perry founder of Project Yellow Ribbon and a mother of a soldier Edward serving in Iraq, along with Helping Hands of New York have joined forces with OAAS, Inc. Together they have been tireless volunteers and contributor to OAAS, Inc. almost from its beginning and we are proud to have them aboard Operation Adopt a Soldier. Terri is Co-Chair for OAS.

What we do?

WE

- 1.) Send packages to our soldiers
- 2.) Enlist the help of children from churches, schools and various civic organizations to send cards, letters of thanks, holiday greetings and letters of comfort to our soldiers.
- 3.) Support family members through our Family Readiness Program.
- 4.) Have a wide range of events such as rallies, hot dog sales, strawberry socials, dances, auctions, etc.

- 6.) Have a volunteer staff of plumbers, electricians, carpenters, pastoral care, computer specialists, car care, finances, counselors, and referral to support groups.
- 7.) Give presentations to churches, schools, youth groups and etc.
- 8.) Support other various veterans organizations.
